REPORT

The Government is committed to reducing air pollution and as part of a national strategy has introduced a new air pollution information service. This free of charge service provides detailed easy to understand information on air pollution which is particularly useful to people with certain medical conditions.

The Department of the Environment Transport and the Regions booklet **Air Pollution And What It Means To Your Health** is an easy guide to the new air pollution information service and copies are available free of charge from the Department.

The Council is committed to supporting the Government in reducing air pollution and is assessing local air quality throughout the district against national air quality objectives.

The Councils mobile air quality laboratory is being located in each of the six population centres for a three month period on a planned programme to further the review of air quality throughout the district and will be relocated from Bellshill town centre to Airdrie town centre during September, 1998.
