1.A smell has been reported coming from the drains outside the baker's shop in Lauchope Street.Could this be investigated and any remedial action necessary be taken.

2.Woodhall Estate.

4.Car parking.

Residents in Queen's Crescent are willing to make driveways into thier gardens to take cars off the street.However they are making no progress through the planning department.

5.Credit Union.

Training will start in October for people interested in volunteering to assist in the running of a Credit union in the Chapelhall area.Anyone interested can find out more at the next Community Council meeting which will be held on Wednesday 30th September in the Senior Citizen's Centre in Lauchope Street.

Chapelhall Community Council Meeting 30.9.98.

1.The Boundary Commission have replied on the petition and Community Council proposals on thier anxieties concerning the proposed changes which would split Chapelhall into two different electoral wards.It would appear now that Chapelhall will remain as a single electoral unit.

2.The Community Council have arranged a meeting with Mister Thompson at 10.30 on 6.10.98.to discuss maintenance and grass cutting in the sheltered housing complex.

3.The condition of the roads in Chapelhall is causing concern within the community,particularly with new residents in the area who say they have never seen roads in a worse state.

4.The build up of rubbish from the Chinese and Indian take away shops,Lauchope Street,at the weekends,is disgusting.Could this matter be looked into by the appropriate authority

5.A representative of Strathclyde Credit Union Development Agency attended the meeting to explain the general outline of a Credit Union's role in the community and ask for volunteers to come forward to be trained in the operation of a credit union. It is expected that training will take approximately one year normally through weekly courses of 1-2 hours.
