## 1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1 This report seeks to update the Partnership and Committee on the progress made on the Airdrie Town Centre Action Plan projects and initiatives. The report also provides an update on progress made on developing a new Town Centre Framework and Action Plan for Airdrie town centre.

## 2. Airdrie Town Centre Framework and Action Plan

- 2.1 Public consultation on the finalised draft Airdrie Town Centre Framework and Action Plan will take place during November / December 2014. The documents will be available online through the Planning Consultation hub for a period of 8 weeks.

## 3 Project Updates

- 3.1 Heritage Lottery Fund – Townscape Heritage Bid - A revised bid, as supported by Planning and Transportation Committee, has been submitted to the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) under their Townscape Heritage programme. Heritage Lottery will advise whether or not it has been successful in January 2015.
- 3.2 Sir John Wilson Town Hall - Lighting - The bat surveys have been carried out over the summer. No bats were found. The listed building application has been re-submitted for consideration. The anticipated start date for the lighting works is now winter 2014.

## 4. Town Centre Activities Update

- 4.1 Overall Airdrie is noted as having a relatively low vacancy rate (at some 8.8%) when compared with the other town centres in North Lanarkshire. In the period from April to June 2014 three businesses closed and fourteen opened.
- 4.2 Footfall figures for the period April to June 2014, as recorded on automated counters located throughout the centre, show an increase in levels of activity compared to the previous quarter January to March 2014, and a year ago.


\*The vacant Rialto building in Airdrie has had some considerable private investment and has now been renovated into 5 new shop units with flats above.
