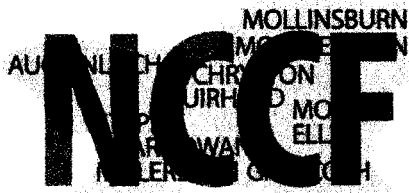

<p>5.</p>	<p>Matters Arising:</p> <p>1. Environmental Improvement Project:</p> <p>Andrew said that £30k has been allocated to this project to help improve local area in Muirhead/Chryston. A walk about with Andrew and members in area had taken place and the Forum members suggested areas for improvement. Andrew went on to say that he now has proposals for members to discuss and to agree on those to take forward as the estimated cost was greater than the budget. Andrew said Martin Dickson, Regeneration Manager had agreed to put in a bid for funding for a Phase 2 to complete the project. Plans were shown for the areas proposed for improvement to which members discussed each of the proposals in turn and agreed priorities for Phase 1. These included gateway entrance signs to Muirhead/Chryston, street tree planting and benches, replacement of the bollards at the Airdrie Savings Bank and painting railings on Lindsaybeg Road. In regard to the war memorial, it was suggested that this be included in Phase 2. It was noted that it is the anniversary of the start of World War 1 next year and that a plaque to commemorate the anniversary should be placed at the War Memorial and that it be renovated for next year's anniversary. Tom to contact the British Legion regarding the wording for the plaque. Also Roslyn to enquire within the Council about additional funding for War Memorial renovation from Scottish Government</p> <p>The Forum agreed to remove the proposal of renovating the footpath across the park from phase one and include it in phase two.</p> <p>After discussions regarding all proposals, members agreed to have the entrance feature similar to the one at Gartcosh, dry stone wall with stainless steel letterings. Andrew concluded that he is hoping that the will commence by the end of October 2013.</p> <p>Marvyn Mackay asked the Forum to consider a bid of £45k being submitted to the Local Area Partnership for a similar project in Stepps/Millerston/Cardowan in 2014/15. This was agreed.</p> <p>2. Re-Shaping Care for Older People:</p> <p>Chair updated members on last year's local activity funding and advised how this funding had been distributed to community group/organisations in the area. There is a further budget allocation of £15k for 2013 – 2014. However, new applications submitted should not be a repeat of the project funded in the previous year. Application forms are available from CACE who will provide guidance and support in completing these. There will be an open day event in Chryston Cultural Centre around 22/23/24 October, still to be confirmed. This event will provide help and support in completing applications. 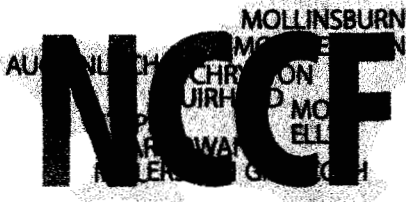

Local Area Team Action Plan:</p> <p>The revised plan was awaited following a meeting attended by the Chairs of the three Forums.</p> <p>5. Public consultations will take place if there are to be changes to services and all decisions require to be made by December. Marvyn said that he will keep members updated.
