(NO WAITING AND NO LOADING RESTRICTIONS) ORDER 2007

(NO WAITING AND NO LOADING RESTRICTIONS) ORDER 2007

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Strathclyde Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order.

(1) This Order may be cited as "The North Lanarkshire Council (West Canal Street & Heritage Way, Coatbridge) (No Waiting and No Loading Restrictions) Order 2007" and shall come into operation on Monday, the twenty-sixth day of February, Two thousand and Seven.

(2) In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-

"vehicle" unless the context otherwise requires, means a vehicle of any description and includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along roads whether or not by mechanical power;

"taxi" has the same meaning as in Section 23(1) of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 and;

"Council" means the North Lanarkshire Council.

(3) Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait or to load at any time in the length of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this Order or to wait at any time in the length of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.

(4) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall:-

(a) prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the length of road referred to in that Article:-

(A) for so long as may be necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load thereon or unload therefrom his/her personal luggage;

(B) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of the roads so referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of the roads, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

(C) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties and in particular, but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with police, fire brigade and ambulance purposes;

(D) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;

- (E) if the vehicle is in the service of or employed by the Post Office and is waiting in any of the lengths of the roads while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent thereto are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent thereto;
 - (F) for the purpose of loading or unloading the vehicle while the vehicle is standing at the kerb and is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwellinghouse to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository, and
 - (G) to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with funeral and wedding operations, and
- (b) apply to a licensed taxi waiting in a taxi stance during any period for which that stance has been designated by the Council under the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982.
- (5) The Burgh of Coatbridge (West Canal Street) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1973 will be revoked as part of this Order as relative to Schedule II of this Order.
- (6) The Burgh of Coatbridge (Town Centre) (Various Streets) (Restrictions on Waiting) Order 1967 will be amended as specified in Schedule III of this Order.

<u>West Canal Street, Coatbridge</u> From its junction with Sunnyside Roundabout north-westwards then south-westwards for a distance of 198 metres or thereby.	Both
<u>Heritage Way, Coatbridge</u> The length of Heritage Way from its junction with West Canal Street northwards for a distance of 29 metres or thereby	Both

The Burgh of Coatbridge (Town Centre) (Various Streets) (Restrictions on Waiting) Order 1967

In schedule I, delete West Canal Street on the North side from its junction with Sunnyside Road westwards to the west side of the Island at Railway Station and West Canal Street on the South side from the Whitelaw Fountain westwards to a point opposite the west side of the Island at Railway Station.
