PROPOSED 20 MPH SPEED LIMIT ORDER

The North Lanarkshire Council propose to consider the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order, the effect of which will be to introduce a 20 miles per hour speed limit on A89 Coatbridge Road and Glasgow Road from a point on A89 Coatbridge Road, 28 metres west of the extended line of the west kerb of Oakridge Road, eastwards to a point on Glasgow Road 125 metres east of the extended line of the east kerb of Oakridge Road for a distance of 168 metres or thereby. The Speed Limit Order will only be effective when the lights are flashing on the speed limit signs.

(20 MPH Speed Limit) Order 2007

The North Lanarkshire Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”) and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Strathclyde Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order.

1. This Order may be cited as “The North Lanarkshire Council (Drumpark School, A89 Coatbridge Road, Glasgow Road, Bargeddie) (20 MPH Speed Limit) Order 2007” and shall come into operation on Monday, the third day of December, Two Thousand and Seven.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding twenty miles per hour on the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order.
3. This Order will only be in force when the Speed Limit Signs are activated.

20 MPH SPEED LIMIT

The length of A89 Coatbridge Road and Glasgow Road from a point on A89 Coatbridge Road, 28 metres west of the extended line of the west kerb of Oakridge Road, eastwards to a point on Glasgow Road 125 metres east of the extended line of the east kerb of Oakridge Road a distance of 168 metres or thereby.
