PROPOSED 30 MPH SPEED LIMIT ORDER

The North Lanarkshire Council propose to consider the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order, the effect of which will be to introduce a 30 miles per hour speed limit on B804 Johnston Road, Gartcosh from its junction with A752 Lochend Road, eastwards to a point 460 metres east of the extended line of the eastern kerb of Inchnock Avenue, a distance of 810 metres or thereby. The proposed Order will also amend The North Lanarkshire Council (A752 Coatbridge Road, B804 Johnston Road and B806 Gartloch Road, Gartcosh) (Restricted Roads) Order 2001 by deleting from the schedule of that Order "That length of the B804 (Johnston Road) in Gartcosh extending from its junction with the east kerbline of the A752 (Lochend Road) in an easterly direction to a point 73 metres east of the extended east kerbline of Inchnock Avenue, a distance of 415 metres or thereby".

30 MPH SPEED LIMIT ORDER 2011

The North Lanarkshire Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”) and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Strathclyde Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order.

1. This Order may be cited as “The North Lanarkshire Council (B804 Johnston Road, Gartcosh) (30 MPH Speed Limit) Order 2011” and shall come into operation on Monday, the thirteenth day of June, Two Thousand and eleven.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding thirty miles per hour on the length of road specified in the Schedule I to this Order.
3. The North Lanarkshire Council (A752 Coatbridge Road, B804 Johnston Road and B806 Gartloch Road, Gartcosh) (Restricted Roads) Order 2001 are amended as specified in Schedule II to this Order.

30 MPH SPEED LIMIT

Length(s) of Road in the region of

B804 Johnston Road, Gartcosh

The length of B804 Johnston Road from its junction with A752 Lochend Road, eastwards to a point 460 metres east of the extended line of the eastern kerb of Inchnock Avenue, a distance of 810 metres or thereby.
