ST MARGARET'S HIGH SCHOOL, BORE ROAD AND DRUMBATHIE ROAD, AIRDRIE

PROPOSED 20 MPH SPEED LIMIT ORDER

The North Lanarkshire Council propose to consider the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order, the effect of which will be to introduce a 20 miles per hour speed limit on Bore Road and Drumbathie Road, Airdrie, as detailed below:-

Bore Road, Airdrie

From a point 22 metres south of the extended line of the southern kerb of Waverly Drive, south eastwards for a distance of 137 metres or thereby.

Drumbathie Road, Airdrie

From a point 14 metres west of the extended line of the western kerb of Springwells Avenue, westwards for a distance of 122 metres or thereby.

North Lanarkshire Council

(St Margaret's High School, Bore Road and Drumbathie Road, Airdrie 30 MPH and Part-Time 20 MPH Speed Limit) Order 2012

The North Lanarkshire Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Strathclyde Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The North Lanarkshire Council (St Margaret's High School, Bore Road and Drumbathie Road, Airdrie 30 MPH and Part-Time 20 MPH Speed Limit) Order 2012" and shall come into operation on Wednesday, the fourteenth day of November, Two thousand and twelve.
2. The length of roads specified in Schedule 2 of this Order shall cease to be restricted roads for the purposes of Section 81 of the Act.
3.
 - (1) No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding twenty miles per hour on the length of roads specified in Schedule 1 of this Order, when such speed limit applies to that length of road in accordance with sub-paragraph (2) below.
 - (2) A twenty miles per hour speed limit will apply to the length of roads specified in Schedule 1 of this Order only when the speed limit signs are activated.
 - (3) Without prejudice to the provisions of sub-paragraphs (1) and (2) above, no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding thirty miles per hour on the length of roads specified in Schedule 2 of this Order.

SCHEDULE 1

PART-TIME 20 MPH SPEED LIMIT

Bore Road, Airdrie

From a point 22 metres south of the extended line of the southern kerb of Waverley Drive, south eastwards for a distance of 137 metres or thereby.

Drumbathie Road, Airdrie

From a point 14 metres west of the extended line of the western kerb of Springwells Avenue, westwards for a distance of 122 metres or thereby.

SCHEDULE 2

30 MPH SPEED LIMIT

Bore Road, Airdrie

From the extended line of the southern kerb of Waverley Drive, south westwards to the extended line of the northern kerb of Drumbathie Road, a distance of 340 metres or thereby.

Drumbathie Road, Airdrie

From the extended line of the eastern kerb of Bore Road, eastwards to the extended line of the western kerb of Drumgelloch Street, a distance of 772 metres or thereby.
