TRYST ROAD AND YULE WAY, CUMBERNAULD

PROPOSED WAITING RESTRICTIONS ORDER

The North Lanarkshire Council propose to consider the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order, the effect of which will be to introduce waiting restrictions on Tryst Road and Yule Way, Cumbernauld as detailed below:-

NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

Length(s) of Road in the Region of North Lanarkshire

Side of Road to which restriction applies

Tryst Road

From the termination of Tryst Road (at the entrance to the service yard for the Antonine Shopping Centre) north eastwards for a distance of 64 metres or thereby.

North west

From a point 89 metres or thereby, north east of the termination of Tryst Road (at the entrance to the service yard for the Antonine Shopping Centre) north eastwards and northwards to its junction with A8011 Central Way, a distance of 120 metres or thereby.

North west and west

From the termination of Tryst Road (at the entrance to the service yard for the Antonine Shopping Centre), north eastwards for a distance of 58 metres or thereby.

South east

From a point 113 metres or thereby, north east of the termination of Tryst Road (at the entrance to the service yard for the Antonine Shopping Centre), north eastwards and northwards to its junction with A8011 Central Way, a distance of 123 metres or thereby.

South east and east

Yule Way

From the extended line of the south eastern kerb of Tryst Road, south eastwards to its junction with North Carbrain Road, a distance of 179 metres or thereby.

Both

DESIGNATED PARKING PLACES

Length(s) of Road in the Region of North Lanarkshire

Side of Road to which parking place applies

Tryst Road

From a point 64 metres or thereby north east of the termination of Tryst Road (at the entrance to the service yard for the Antonine Shopping Centre), north eastwards for a distance of 25 metres or thereby.

North west

From a point 58 metres or thereby north east of the termination of Tryst Road (at the entrance to the service yard for the Antonine Shopping Centre), north eastwards for a distance of 55 metres or thereby.

South east

(Waiting Restrictions) Order 2014

The North Lanarkshire Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”) and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Police Scotland in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order.

1. This Order may be cited as “The North Lanarkshire Council (Tryst Road and Yule Way, Cumbernauld) (Waiting Restrictions) Order 2014” and shall come into operation on Monday, the twenty-eighth day of July, Two thousand and fourteen.
2. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-

“vehicle” unless the context otherwise requires, means a vehicle of any description and includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along roads whether or not by mechanical power;

“taxi” has the same meaning as in Section 23(1) of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982;

“Council” means the North Lanarkshire Council.
3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 of this Order.
4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall:-
 - a) prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the length of road referred to in that Article:-
 - A) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of the roads so referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of the roads, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - B) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties and in particular, but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with police, fire brigade and ambulance purposes;

- C) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
 - D) if the vehicle is waiting in any of the lengths of the roads while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent thereto are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent thereto;
- b) apply to any disabled person's vehicle which is not causing an obstruction and which displays a disabled person's badge issued by a local authority in exercise of its powers under section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970, and
 - c) apply to a licensed taxi waiting in a taxi stance during any period for which that stance has been designated by the Council under the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982.

From the termination of Tryst Road (at the entrance to the service yard for the Antonine Shopping Centre) north eastwards for a distance of 64 metres or thereby.

North west

From a point 89 metres or thereby, north east of the termination of Tryst Road (at the entrance to the service yard for the Antonine Shopping Centre) north eastwards and northwards to its junction with A8011 Central Way, a distance of 120 metres or thereby.

North west and
west

From the termination of Tryst Road (at the entrance to the service yard for the Antonine Shopping Centre), north eastwards for a distance of 58 metres or thereby.

South east

From a point 113 metres or thereby, north east of the termination of Tryst Road (at the entrance to the service yard for the Antonine Shopping Centre), north eastwards and northwards to its junction with A8011 Central Way, a distance of 123 metres or thereby.

South east and
east

Yule Way

From the extended line of the south eastern kerb of Tryst Road, south eastwards to its junction with North Carbrain Road, a distance of 179 metres or thereby.

From a point 58 metres or thereby, north east of the termination of Tryst Road (at the entrance to the service yard for the Antonine Shopping Centre), north eastwards for a distance of 55 metres or thereby.
