Westcraigs Road, Harthill

(Temporary Road Closure) Order 2006

On 20 September 2006 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on carriageway reconstruction works) on Westcraigs Road, Harthill from its junction with (B7066) East Main Street continuing northwards for a distance of 15 metres or thereby by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

The appropriate diversion signing will be in place advising drivers of the restrictions associated with the carriageway reconstruction works at this location and the closure will only be valid when the appropriate signing is in place.

Alternative routes:- Vehicles on the north side of the closure should proceed northwards on (B718) Westcraigs Road, then north-westwards on Harthill Road, and westwards on (A89) West Main Street, southwards on (B8084) South Street, south-eastwards and southwards on (B8084) Station Road, south-westwards and westwards on (B7066) East Main Street to the south side of the closure .

Vehicles on the southside of the closure to proceed vice-versa.

Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

Vehicular access to adjacent premises will be maintained, where possible, by arrangement with the contractor during the closure.

The Order will come into operation at 0001 hours on Monday, 2 October 2006 and will remain in operation until 2359 hours on Sunday, 24 December 2006.

(Temporary Road Closure) Order 2006

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as “The North Lanarkshire Council (Westcraigs Road, Harthill) (Temporary Road Closure) Order 2006” and shall be effective during the period from 0001 hours on Monday the second day of October two thousand and six until 2359 hours on Sunday the twenty fourth day of December two thousand and six.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on carriageway reconstruction works) on Westcraigs Road, Harthill from its junction with (B7066) East Main Street continuing northwards for a distance of 15 metres or thereby by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

The appropriate diversion signing will be in place advising drivers of the restrictions associated with the carriageway reconstruction works at this location and the closure will only be valid when the appropriate signing is in place.

Alternative routes:- Vehicles on the north side of the closure should proceed northwards on (B718) Westcraigs Road, then north-westwards on Harthill Road, and westwards on (A89) West Main Street, southwards on (B8084) South Street, south-eastwards and southwards on (B8084) Station Road, south-westwards and westwards on (B7066) East Main Street to the south side of the closure .

Vehicles on the southside of the closure to proceed vice-versa.

Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

Vehicular access to adjacent premises will be maintained, where possible, by arrangement with the contractor during the closure.
