(Temporary 30mph Speed Limit) Order 2007

On 28 March 2007 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour on Bowhousebrae Road from a point 100 metres east of the extended line of the eastern gable of No32 Bowhousebrae Road to a point 40 metres south of the extended line of the southern gable of Gartness Cottage by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

The Order will come into operation at 0001 hours on Monday, 9 April 2007 and will remain in operation until 2359 hours on Friday, 12 October 2007.

(Temporary 30 MPH Speed Restriction) Order 2007

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as “The North Lanarkshire Council (Bowhousebrae Road, Airdrie) (Temporary 30 MPH Speed Restriction) Order 2007” and shall be effective during the period from 0001 hours on Monday, the ninth day of April, two thousand and seven until 2359 hours on Friday, the twelfth day of October, Two thousand and seven.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour on Bowhousebrae Road from a point 100 metres east of the extended line of the eastern gable of No32 Bowhousebrae Road to a point 40 metres south of the extended line of the southern gable of Gartness Cottage by reason of works being executed on or near that location.
