(Temporary Closure) Order 2009

On 4 March 2009 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on footway patching works) on Devonview Street, Airdrie from its junction with Victoria Place to its junction with Thomson Drive by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

Alternative routes: Eastbound vehicles travelling towards the north side of the closure wishing to access the south side of the closure should continue north-eastwards on Victoria Place, south-eastwards and south-westwards on Woodburn Avenue and north-westwards on Thomson Drive to the south side of the closure.

Southbound vehicles travelling towards the south side of the closure wishing to access the north side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Westbound vehicles travelling towards the north side of the closure wishing to access the south side of the closure should continue south-westwards on Victoria Place, south-eastwards and north-eastwards on Victoria Crescent and south-eastwards on Thomson Drive to the south side of the closure.

Northbound vehicles travelling towards the south side of the closure wishing to access the north side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Diversion routes will be signposted.

Pedestrian access will be maintained, where practical, during the closure.

Vehicular access will be maintained, where practical, during the closure.

The Order will come into operation at 0001 hours on Monday, 16 March 2009 and will remain in operation until 2359 hours on Friday, 27 March 2009.

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The North Lanarkshire Council (Devonview Street, Airdrie) (Temporary Closure) Order 2009" and shall be effective during the period from 0001 hours on Monday, the sixteenth day of March, two thousand and nine until 2359 hours on Friday, the twenty-seventh day of March, Two thousand and nine.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on footway patching works) on Devonview Street, Airdrie from its junction with Victoria Place to its junction with Thomson Drive by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

Alternative routes: Eastbound vehicles travelling towards the north side of the closure wishing to access the south side of the closure should continue north-eastwards on Victoria Place, south-eastwards and south-westwards on Woodburn Avenue and north-westwards on Thomson Drive to the south side of the closure.

Southbound vehicles travelling towards the south side of the closure wishing to access the north side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Westbound vehicles travelling towards the north side of the closure wishing to access the south side of the closure should continue south-westwards on Victoria Place, south-eastwards and north-eastwards on Victoria Crescent and south-eastwards on Thomson Drive to the south side of the closure.

Northbound vehicles travelling towards the south side of the closure wishing to access the north side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Diversion routes will be signposted.

Pedestrian access will be maintained, where practical, during the closure.

Vehicular access will be maintained, where practical, during the closure.
