Thrashbush Road & South Commonhead Avenue, Airdrie

(Temporary Closures) Order 2009

On 24 June 2009 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on drainage works) on the following roads by reason of works being executed on or near those locations.

Thrashbush Road, Airdrie

From a point 10 metres north west of the extended line of the northern kerb of South Commonhead Avenue, south eastwards to a point 10 metres south east of the extended line of the southern kerb of South Commonhead Avenue.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the north west side of the closure wishing to access the south east side of the closure should proceed north westwards on Thrashbush Road, south westwards and westwards on Dykehead Road, south eastwards on Commonhead Street, Commonsie Street and North Bridge Street, north eastwards on Chapel Street and Aitken Street and north westwards on Thrashbush Road to the south east side of the closure.

Vehicles on the south east side of the closure wishing to access the north west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

South Commonhead Avenue, Airdrie

From its junction with Thrashbush Road, south westwards for a distance of 10 metres or thereby.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north west side of the closure should proceed south westwards on South Commonhead Avenue, south eastwards on Mill Road, south westwards on Aitken Street and Chapel Street, north westwards on North Bridge Street, Commonsie Street and Commonhead Street, eastwards then north eastwards on Dykehead Road and south eastwards on Thrashbush Road to the north west side of the closure.

Vehicles on the north west side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the south east side of the closure should proceed south westwards on South Commonhead Avenue, south eastwards on Mill Road, north eastwards on Aitken Street and north westwards on Thrashbush Road to the south east side of the closure.

Vehicles on the south east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Pedestrian access will be maintained, where practicable, by arrangement with the contractor.

Vehicular access will be maintained, where practicable, by arrangement with the contractor.

The Order will come into operation at 0600 hours on Monday, 6 July 2009 and will remain in operation until 1800 hours on Sunday, 26 July 2009.

(Temporary Closures) Order 2009

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The North Lanarkshire Council (Thrashbush Road & South Commonhead Avenue, Airdrie) (Temporary Closures) Order 2009" and shall be effective during the period from 0600 hours on Monday, the sixth day of July, two thousand and nine until 1800 hours on Sunday, the twenty-sixth day of July, Two thousand and nine.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with exception of vehicles engaged on drainage works) on the following roads by reason of works being executed on or near those locations.

Thrashbush Road, Airdrie

From a point 10 metres north west of the extended line of the northern kerb of South Commonhead Avenue, south eastwards to a point 10 metres south east of the extended line of the southern kerb of South Commonhead Avenue.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the north west side of the closure wishing to access the south east side of the closure should proceed north westwards on Thrashbush Road, south westwards and westwards on Dykehead Road, south eastwards on Commonhead Street, Commonsie Street and North Bridge Street, north eastwards on Chapel Street and Aitken Street and north westwards on Thrashbush Road to the south east side of the closure.

Vehicles on the south east side of the closure wishing to access the north west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

South Commonhead Avenue, Airdrie

From its junction with Thrashbush Road, south westwards for a distance of 10 metres or thereby.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north west side of the closure should proceed south westwards on South Commonhead Avenue, south eastwards on Mill Road, south westwards on Aitken Street and Chapel Street, north westwards on North Bridge Street, Commonsie Street and Commonhead Street, eastwards then north eastwards on Dykehead Road and south eastwards on Thrashbush Road to the north west side of the closure.

Vehicles on the north west side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the south east side of the closure should proceed south westwards on South Commonhead Avenue, south eastwards on Mill Road, north eastwards on Aitken Street and north westwards on Thrashbush Road to the south east side of the closure.

Vehicles on the south east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Pedestrian access will be maintained, where practicable, by arrangement with the contractor.

Vehicular access will be maintained, where practicable, by arrangement with the contractor.
