

**North Lanarkshire Council**  
**B802 Constarry Road, Croy**  
**(Temporary Road Closure) Order 2009**

On 24 June 2009 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on replacement of traffic calming features) on B802 Constarry Road, Croy from it's junction with Auchinstarry Road to the extended line of the northern kerb of Strath Brennig Road by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

*Alternative routes: Vehicles on the southeast side of the closure wishing to access the northwest side of the closure should proceed southwestwards on Strath Brennig Road, southwestwards on Smithstone Road to Blackwood Roundabout, proceeding around the roundabout and exiting northwestwards on Auchinstarry Road and continuing northwards, northwestwards, northeastwards and northwards on Auchinstarry Road to the northwest side of the closure.*

*Vehicles on the northwest side of the closure wishing to access the southeast side of the closure should proceed vice versa.*

Vehicular access will be maintained to the adjacent properties from at least one end of the closure throughout the period of the works.

Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

These works will be carried out as part of a rolling programme.

The Order will come into operation at 1800 hours on Friday, 10 July 2009 and will remain in operation until 0600 hours on Monday, 7 September 2009 and will be effective only from Fridays to Mondays and only when displayed by signs.

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The North Lanarkshire Council (B802 Constarry Road, Croy) (Temporary Road Closure) Order 2009" and shall be effective during the period from 1800 hours on Friday, the tenth day of July, Two thousand and nine until 0600 hours on Monday, the seventh day of September, Two thousand and nine and will be effective only from Fridays to Mondays and only when displayed by signs.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on replacement of traffic calming measures) on B802 Constarry Road, Croy from it's junction with Auchinstarry Road to the extended line of the northern kerb of Strath Brennig Road by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

*Alternative routes: Vehicles on the southeast side of the closure wishing to access the northwest side of the closure should proceed southwestwards on Strath Brennig Road, southwestwards on Smithstone Road to Blackwood Roundabout, proceeding around the roundabout and exiting northwestwards on Auchinstarry Road and continuing northwards, northwestwards, northeastwards and northwards on Auchinstarry Road to the northwest side of the closure.*

*Vehicles on the northwest side of the closure wishing to access the southeast side of the closure should proceed vice versa.*
