

North Lanarkshire Council
Main Street, Caldercruix
(Temporary Closure) Order 2009

On 5 August 2009 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on replacement of Main Street overbridge as part of the Airdrie to Bathgate Railway Improvement works) on Main Street, Caldercruix from the extended line of the southern kerb of Station Road, south westwards to the extended line of the eastern kerb of Millgate Crescent, a distance of 77 metres or thereby by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the north east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed north eastwards on Main Street, southwards on B825 Eastfield Road, westwards on A89 Airdrie Road and northwards and north eastwards along Main Street to the south west side of the closure.

Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north east side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Pedestrians on the north east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed south westwards and north westwards on Station Road, south eastwards on footbridge (adjacent to No 5 Station Road) and north eastwards on Main Street to the south west side of the closure.

Pedestrians on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north east side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

The Order will come into operation at 0700 hours on Friday, 21 August 2009 and will remain in operation until 1800 hours on Friday, 20 April 2010.

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The North Lanarkshire Council (Main Street, Caldercruix) (Temporary Closure) Order 2009" and shall be effective during the period from 0700 hours on Friday, the twenty-first day of August, two thousand and nine until 1800 hours on Friday, the twentieth day of April, Two thousand and ten.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on replacement of Main Street overbridge as part of the Airdrie to Bathgate Railway Improvement works) on Main Street, Caldercruix from the extended line of the southern kerb of Station Road, south westwards to the extended line of the eastern kerb of Millgate Crescent, a distance of 77 metres or thereby by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the north east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed north eastwards on Main Street, southwards on B825 Eastfield Road, westwards on A89 Airdrie Road and northwards and north eastwards along Main Street to the south west side of the closure.

Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north east side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Pedestrians on the north east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed south westwards and north westwards on Station Road, south eastwards on footbridge (adjacent to No 5 Station Road) and north eastwards on Main Street to the south west side of the closure.

Pedestrians on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north east side of the closure should proceed vice versa.
