

**North Lanarkshire Council**  
**Muiredge & Jersey Road, Allanton**  
**(Temporary Road Closure) Order 2009**

On 9 September 2009 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on bridge repair works) on Muiredge and Jersey Road, Allanton from the extended line of the northern kerb of Birniehill Road, north eastwards for a distance of 300 metres or thereby by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

*Alternative routes: Vehicles on the north east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed north eastwards on Muiredge and Jersey Road, south eastwards, south westwards and southwards on Newmill and Canthill Road, south westwards on Hartwood Road, north westwards and south westwards on Foulburn Road and north westwards then north eastwards on Muiredge and Jersey Road to the south west side of the closure.*

*Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north east side of the closure should proceed vice versa.*

Vehicular access to adjacent premises will be maintained, where possible, by arrangement with the contractor during the closure.

Pedestrian access will be maintained, where applicable.

The Order, which will only be effective when displayed by signs, will come into operation at 0001 hours on Monday, 21 September 2009 and will remain in operation until 2359 hours on Sunday, 9 October 2009.

**(Temporary Road Closure) Order 2009**

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The North Lanarkshire Council (Muiredge & Jersey Road, Allanton) (Temporary Road Closure) "Order 2009" and shall be effective during the period from 0001 hours on Monday, the twenty first day of September, Two thousand and nine until 2359 hours on Sunday, the ninth day of October, Two thousand and nine.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on bridge repair works) on Muiredge and Jersey Road, Allanton from the extended line of the northern kerb of Birniehill Road, north eastwards for a distance of 300 metres or thereby by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

*Alternative routes: Vehicles on the north east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed north eastwards on Muiredge and Jersey Road, south eastwards, south westwards and southwards on Newmill and Canthill Road, south westwards on Hartwood Road, north westwards and south westwards on Foulburn Road and north westwards then north eastwards on Muiredge and Jersey Road to the south west side of the closure.*

*Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north east side of the closure should proceed vice versa.*

Vehicular access to adjacent premises will be maintained, where possible, by arrangement with the contractor during the closure.

Pedestrian access will be maintained, where applicable.
