B804 Main Street, Glenboig
(Temporary Road Closure) Order 2009

On 21 October 2009 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on repairs to the railway bridge and installation of new gas main) on B804 Main Street, Glenboig from the extended line of the western kerb of Glenboig New Road westwards for a distance of 115 metres or thereby, by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the east side of the closure wishing to access the west side of the closure should proceed south eastwards on B804 Main Street, B804 Coatbridge Road, B804 Gartliston Road and B804 Coltswood Road, southwards on B804 Dunbeth Road, north westwards and south westwards on A89 Bank Street, north westwards on Glasgow Road, northwards on A752 Gartcosh Road, eastwards on B804 Johnston Road, and south eastwards on B804 Glenboig Road and B804 Main Street to the west side of the closure.

Vehicles on the west side of the closure wishing to access the east side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the closure.

Vehicular access to adjacent premises will be maintained, where possible, by arrangement with the contractor during the closure.

The Order, which will only be effective when displayed by signs, will come into operation at 0700 hours on Monday, 2 November 2009 and will remain in operation until 2359 hours on Sunday, 13 December, 2009.

(Temporary Road Closure) Order 2009

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The North Lanarkshire Council (B804 Main Street, Glenboig) (Temporary Road Closure) Order 2009" and shall be effective during the period from 0700 hours on Monday, the second day of November, Two thousand and nine until 2359 hours on Sunday, the thirteenth day of December, Two thousand and nine.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on repairs to the railway bridge and installation of new gas main) on B804 Main Street, Glenboig from the extended line of the western kerb of Glenboig New Road westwards for a distance of 115 metres or thereby, by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the east side of the closure wishing to access the west side of the closure should proceed south eastwards on B804 Main Street, B804 Coatbridge Road, B804 Gartliston Road and B804 Coltswood Road, southwards on B804 Dunbeth Road, north westwards and south westwards on A89 Bank Street, north westwards on Glasgow Road, northwards on A752 Gartcosh Road, eastwards on B804 Johnston Road, and south eastwards on B804 Glenboig Road and B804 Main Street to the west side of the closure.

Vehicles on the west side of the closure wishing to access the east side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the closure.

Vehicular access to adjacent premises will be maintained, where possible, by arrangement with the contractor during the closure.
