**A8011 Wilderness Brae, Cumbernauld**

**(Temporary Footpath Closure) Order 2010**

On 23 June 2010 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to proceed on foot (with the exception of pedestrians engaged on bridge works associated with the construction of the M80) on A8011 Wilderness Brae, Cumbernauld from its junction with Roadside, northwards for a distance of 230 metres or thereby on the footpath adjacent to the north bound carriageway of the A8011 Wilderness Brae and eastwards and north eastwards for a distance of 113 metres or thereby on the footpath to its junction with the footpath on the south side of Castlecary Road, by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

*Alternative routes: Pedestrians on the south west side of the closure wishing to access Castlecary Road on the north east side of the closure should proceed southwards on A8011 Wilderness Brae, south westwards on Roadside, northwards on the unnamed footpath leading to Eastfield Road, north eastwards then south eastwards on Eastfield Road, and south eastwards across the central reserve on Castlecary Road to the north east side of the closure.*

*Pedestrians on Castlecary Road on the north east side of the closure wishing to access Roadside on the south west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.*

The Order will come into operation at 0001 hours on Monday, 5 July 2010 and will remain in operation until 2359 hours on Friday, 24 December 2010.

**(Temporary Footpath Closure) Order 2010**

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restriction) Act 1991), and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

- (1) This Order may be cited as "The North Lanarkshire Council (A8011 Wilderness Brae, Cumbernauld) (Temporary Footpath Closure) Order 2010" and shall be effective during the period from 0001 hours on Monday, the fifth day of July, Two thousand and ten until 2359 hours on Friday, the twenty fourth day of December, Two thousand and ten.
- (2) No person shall proceed on foot (with the exception of pedestrians engaged on bridge works associated with the construction of the M80) on A8011 Wilderness Brae, Cumbernauld from its junction with Roadside, northwards for a distance of 230 metres or thereby on the footpath adjacent to the north bound carriageway of the A8011 Wilderness Brae and eastwards and north eastwards for a distance of 113 metres or thereby on the footpath to its junction with the footpath on the south side of Castlecary Road, by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

*Alternative routes: Pedestrians on the south west side of the closure wishing to access Castlecary Road on the north east side of the closure should proceed southwards on A8011 Wilderness Brae, south westwards on Roadside, northwards on the unnamed footpath leading to Eastfield Road, north eastwards then south eastwards on Eastfield Road, and south eastwards across the central reserve on Castlecary Road to the north east side of the closure.*

*Pedestrians on Castlecary Road on the north east side of the closure wishing to access Roadside on the south west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.*
