(Temporary No Waiting and No Loading) Order 2010

The North Lanarkshire Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 62 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, make the above-named Order to be observed by vehicles between 0700 hours and 2200 hours on Saturday, 7 August 2010, the Order being notified on the roads by the use of Police "No Waiting" cones.

No Waiting or Loading

To apply on both sides of Dryburgh Road, Wishaw from a point 15 metres or thereby north east of the extended line of the northern kerb of Glenpark Street, north eastwards then north westwards to the extended line of the southern kerb of Carrick Crescent.

Contravention of the Order, which may be inspected at Corporate Services, Civic Centre, Windmillhill Street, Motherwell, could result in a penalty of up to £500.

No Waiting or Loading
