**Condorrat On-Slip Road to A8011 Glasgow Road (Westbound Carriageway),
Cumbernauld**

(Temporary Road Closure) Order 2011

On 26 January 2011 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on bridge works in association with the M80 upgrade) on the unnamed on-slip road to the westbound carriageway of the A8011 Glasgow Road from its junction with the Condorrat Ring Road and the A8011 Glasgow Road, by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the south east side of the closure wishing to access the west bound carriageway of the A8011 Glasgow Road should continue northwards, westwards and southwards on the unnamed eastbound on-slip road from Condorrat Interchange to A8011 Glasgow Road, proceed north eastwards on A8011 Glasgow Road and north eastwards on the un-named off slip road to Seafar Roundabout, proceed around the roundabout and exit south westwards on the un-named on-slip road to the westbound carriageway of the A8011 Glasgow Road.

Appropriate signage will be in place advising drivers of the restrictions during the closure. The closure will only be valid when appropriate signing is in place.

The Order will come into operation at 0001 hours on Sunday, 13 February 2011 and will remain in operation until 2359 hours on Monday, 16 May 2011.

(Temporary Road Closure) Order 2011

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as “The North Lanarkshire Council (Condorrat On-Slip Road to A8011 Glasgow Road (Westbound Carriageway), Cumbernauld) (Temporary Road Closure) Order 2011” and shall be effective during the period from 0001 hours on Sunday, the thirteenth day of February, Two thousand and eleven until 2359 hours on Monday, the sixteenth day of May, Two thousand and eleven.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on bridge works in association with the M80 upgrade) on the unnamed on-slip road to the westbound carriageway of the A8011 Glasgow Road from its junction with the Condorrat Ring Road and the A8011 Glasgow Road, by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the south east side of the closure wishing to access the west bound carriageway of the A8011 Glasgow Road should continue northwards, westwards and southwards on the unnamed eastbound on-slip road from Condorrat Interchange to A8011 Glasgow Road, proceed north eastwards on A8011 Glasgow Road and north eastwards on the un-named off slip road to Seafar Roundabout, proceed around the roundabout and exit south westwards on the un-named on-slip road to the westbound carriageway of the A8011 Glasgow Road.

Appropriate signage will be in place advising drivers of the restrictions during the closure. The closure will only be valid when appropriate signing is in place.
