

**North Lanarkshire Council**  
**West Hamilton Street, Motherwell**  
**(Temporary Footpath Closure) Order 2011**

On 9 February 2011 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to proceed on foot (with the exception of pedestrians engaged on demolition works associated with the Dalziel Workspace building) on the southern footpath on West Hamilton Street, Motherwell from a point 10 metres or thereby north west of the extended line of the north western wall of the Dalziel Workspace building to a point 10 metres or thereby south east of the extended line of the south eastern wall of the Dalziel Workspace building, a distance of 55 metres or thereby.

*Alternative routes: Pedestrians on the north west side of the closure wishing to access the south east side of the closure should proceed north westwards on the southern footpath on West Hamilton Street, southwards on the unnamed footpath leading to the northern footpath on Mason Street, south eastwards on the northern footpath on Mason Street, north eastwards on the western footpath on Watson Street and north westwards on the western footpath on West Hamilton Street to the south east side of the closure.*

*Pedestrians on the south east side of the closure wishing to access the north west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.*

The Order will come into operation at 0001 hours on Monday, 21 February 2011 and will remain in operation until 2359 hours on Monday, 21 March 2011.

**(Temporary Footpath Closure) Order 2011**

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as “The North Lanarkshire Council (West Hamilton Street, Motherwell) (Temporary Footpath Closure) Order 2011” and shall be effective during the period from 0001 hours on Monday, the twenty first day of February, Two thousand and eleven until 2359 hours on Monday, the twenty first day of March, Two thousand and eleven.
2. No person shall proceed on foot (with the exception of pedestrians engaged on demolition works associated with the Dalziel Workspace building) on the southern footpath on West Hamilton Street, Motherwell from a point 10 metres or thereby north west of the extended line of the north western wall of the Dalziel Workspace building to a point 10 metres or thereby south east of the extended line of the south eastern wall of the Dalziel Workspace building, a distance of 55 metres or thereby.

*Alternative routes: Pedestrians on the north west side of the closure wishing to access the south east side of the closure should proceed north westwards on the southern footpath on West Hamilton Street, southwards on the unnamed footpath leading to the northern footpath on Mason Street, south eastwards on the northern footpath on Mason Street, north eastwards on the western footpath on Watson Street and north westwards on the western footpath on West Hamilton Street to the south east side of the closure.*

*Pedestrians on the south east side of the closure wishing to access the north west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.*
