

North Lanarkshire Council
St John Street, Coatbridge
(Temporary Closure) Order 2011

On 11 July 2011 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 62 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles connected with the Youth Street Fayre) on St John Street, Coatbridge from its junction with Muiryhall Street, southwards for a distance of 82 metres or thereby, by reason of the holding of the Youth Street Fayre.

Alternative routes: There are no alternative routes.

The Order will be in operation from 0001 hours until 2359 on Friday, 29 July 2011.

(Temporary Closure) Order 2011

The North Lanarkshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 62 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as “The North Lanarkshire Council (St John Street, Coatbridge) (Temporary Closure) Order 2011” and shall be effective during the period from 0001 hours until 2359 hours on Friday, the twenty-ninth day of July, Two thousand and eleven.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles connected with the Youth Street Fayre) on St John Street, Coatbridge from its junction with Muirhall Street, southwards for a distance of 82 metres or thereby, by reason of the holding of the Youth Street Fayre.
