

North Lanarkshire Council
Wyndford Road, Cumbernauld
(Temporary Road Closure) Order 2012

On 17 September 2012 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on carriageway subsidence repair works) on Wyndford Road, Cumbernauld from a point 315 metres or thereby, north of the extended line of the northern line kerb of Napier Road north westwards, north eastwards and north westwards for a distance of 1160 metres or thereby by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the north west side of the closure wishing to access Wyndford Road at the south east side of the closure should proceed south westwards on A803, westwards on Stirling Road and Parkfoot Street, proceed around the roundabout exiting and proceeding south eastwards on Airdrie Road, south eastwards, south westwards and south wards on Howe Road, south eastwards on Auchinstarry Road and B8048, proceed around Craiglinn Roundabout exiting and proceeding north westwards on Eastfield Road to Old Inns Roundabout, proceed around the roundabout exiting and proceeding north eastwards on B816 Castlecary Road to the south east side of the closure.

Vehicles on the south east side of the closure wishing to access the north west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

The Order, which continues the restrictions currently in place by virtue of a similar Order made by the Council on Monday, 16 March 2011, will come into operation at 2359 hours on Tuesday, 2 October 2012 and will remain in operation until 2359 hours on Friday, 4 April 2014.

The North Lanarkshire Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order, which may be cited as “The North Lanarkshire Council (Wyndford Road, Cumbernauld) (Temporary Road Closure) Order 2012” which continues the restrictions currently in place by virtue of a similar Order made by the Council on Monday, the sixteenth day of March, Two thousand and eleven, shall be effective during the period from 2359 hours on Tuesday, the second day of October, Two thousand and twelve until 2359 hours on Friday, fourth day of April, Two thousand and fourteen.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on carriageway subsidence repair works) on Wyndford Road, Cumbernauld from a point 315 metres or thereby, north of the extended line of the northern kerb of Napier Road north westwards, north eastwards and north westwards for a distance of 1,160 metres or thereby, by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the north west side of the closure wishing to access Wyndford Road at the south east side of the closure should proceed south westwards on A803, westwards on Stirling Road and Parkfoot Street, proceed around the roundabout exiting and proceeding south eastwards on Airdrie Road, south eastwards, south westwards and south wards on Howe Road, south eastwards on Auchinstarry Road and B8048, proceed around Craiglinn Roundabout exiting and proceeding north westwards on Eastfield Road to Old Inns Roundabout, proceed around the roundabout exiting and proceeding north eastwards on B816 Castlecary Road to the south east side of the closure.

Vehicles on the south east side of the closure wishing to access the north west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.
