Various Streets, Salsburgh

(Temporary Traffic Management) Order 2014

On 6 January 2014 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on bridge works) on the undernoted roads (locations one and two) or shall proceed on foot (with the exception of pedestrians engaged on bridge works) on the undernoted footpath (location three), by reason of works being executed on or near those locations.

Location One

B7066 Hirst Road, Salsburgh from a point 20 metres or thereby, south west of the extended line of the western kerb of David Street, north eastwards for a distance of 57 metres or thereby.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the north east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed north eastwards on B7066 Hirst Road, south westwards on Main Street and Springfield Road and north eastwards on B7066 Hirst Road to the south west side of the closure.

Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north east side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Location Two

Muirhall Terrace, Salsburgh from a point 20 metres or thereby, south west of the extended line of the western kerb of David Street, north eastwards for a distance of 57 metres or thereby.

The following alternative routes will only be operational when B7066 Hirst Road, Salsburgh is open.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north east side of the closure should proceed southwards to B7066 Hirst Road, north eastwards on B7066 Hirst Road and northwards onto Muirhall terrace at the north east side of the closure.

Vehicles on the north east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed north eastwards on Muirhall Terrace, south westwards on B7066 Hirst Road and north eastwards on Muirhall Terrace to the south west side of the closure.

The following alternative routes will only be operational when B7066 Hirst Road, Salsburgh is closed.

Vehicles on the north east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed north eastwards on Muirhall Terrace and B7066 Hirst Road, south westwards on Main Street and Springfield Road and north eastwards on B7066 Hirst Road and Muirhall Terrace to the south west side of the closure.

Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north east side of the closure should proceed southwards to B7066 Hirst Road, south westwards on B7066 Hirst

Road, north eastwards on Springfield Road and Main Street and south westwards on B7066 Hirst Road to the north east side of the closure.

Location Three

David Street, Salsburgh (footpath) from a point 20 metres or thereby, south east of its junction with Main Street, south eastwards to its junction with Muirhall Terrace.

Alternative routes: Pedestrians on the north west side of the closure wishing to access the south east side of the closure should proceed north westwards on the eastern footpath of David Street, north eastwards on the southern footpath of Main Street, south eastwards on the western footpath of Gibson Street and south westwards on the northern footpath of Muirhall Terrace to the south east side of the closure.

Pedestrians on the south east side of the closure wishing to access the north west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

The Order, which will only be valid when signage is in place, will come into operation at 0001 hours on Monday, 20 January 2014 and will remain in operation until 2359 hours on Friday, 2 May 2014.

(Temporary Traffic Management) Order 2014

The North Lanarkshire Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as “The North Lanarkshire Council (Various Streets, Salsburgh) (Temporary Traffic Management) Order 2014” and shall be effective, only when displayed by signs, during the period from 0001 hours on Monday, the twentieth day of January, Two thousand and fourteen until 2359 hours on Friday, the second day of May, Two thousand and fourteen.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on bridge works) on the undernoted roads (locations one and two), or shall proceed on foot (with the exception of pedestrians engaged on bridge works) on the undernoted footpath (location three), by reason of works being executed on or near those locations.

Location One

B7066 Hirst Road, Salsburgh from a point 20 metres or thereby, south west of the extended line of the western kerb of David Street, north eastwards for a distance of 57 metres or thereby.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the north east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed north eastwards on B7066 Hirst Road, south westwards on Main Street and Springfield Road and north eastwards on B7066 Hirst Road to the south west side of the closure.

Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north east side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

Location Two

Muirhall Terrace, Salsburgh from a point 20 metres or thereby, south west of the extended line of the western kerb of David Street, north eastwards for a distance of 57 metres or thereby.

The following alternative routes will only be operational when B7066 Hirst Road, Salsburgh is open.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north east side of the closure should proceed southwards to B7066 Hirst Road, north eastwards on B7066 Hirst Road and northwards onto Muirhall terrace at the north east side of the closure.

Vehicles on the north east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed north eastwards on Muirhall Terrace, south westwards on B7066 Hirst Road and north eastwards on Muirhall Terrace to the south west side of the closure.

The following alternative routes will only be operational when B7066 Hirst Road, Salsburgh is closed.

Vehicles on the north east side of the closure wishing to access the south west side of the closure should proceed north eastwards on Muirhall Terrace and B7066 Hirst Road, south westwards on Main Street and Springfield Road and north eastwards on B7066 Hirst Road and Muirhall Terrace to the south west side of the closure.

Vehicles on the south west side of the closure wishing to access the north east side of the closure should proceed southwards to B7066 Hirst Road, south westwards on B7066 Hirst Road, north eastwards on Springfield Road and Main Street and south westwards on B7066 Hirst Road to the north east side of the closure.

Location Three

David Street, Salsburgh (footpath) from a point 20 metres or thereby, south east of its junction with Main Street, south eastwards to its junction with Muirhall Terrace.

Alternative routes: Pedestrians on the north west side of the closure wishing to access the south east side of the closure should proceed north westwards on the eastern footpath of David Street, north eastwards on the southern footpath of Main Street, south eastwards on the western footpath of Gibson Street and south westwards on the northern footpath of Muirhall Terrace to the south east side of the closure.

Pedestrians on the south east side of the closure wishing to access the north west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.
