Item 2	<p>Open forum for updates since last meeting;</p> <p>H Bainford, update re Kilgarth/Keills meeting</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Barbed wire fencing 5/11 reported to NLC no feed back• John Duffy, no reply – noted in minutes• Request to be raised with councillors <p>Core path no correspondence/Gartgill Rd reported to planning dept. Photographic evidence taken and noted in minutes.</p> <p>Sect 75. info not received any response from P Kelly, NLC Planning.</p> <p>M Black advised all of a complaint received re excessive noise from ' Big Shop', unsuitable parking and the installation of a marquee sited next to the 'Big Shop'. Complaint details were forwarded to both P Kelly, NLC Planning and S Robertson, Strathclyde Police, via email. No response from P Kelly, S Robertson, advised that licence owner has been notified of complaints.</p>

	<p>M Blair raised issue of no road signs re crossing for Lollipop Lady within the village, visiting Community Police advised that they would raise the issue of road signs and markings with the Traffic Dept.</p> <p>A Miller has received correspondence from NLC informing of 40k car park to address traffic within the village, timescale 20/4/2010 .</p> <p>A Miller asked the question to the Community Police if</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Markon actually had a licence for the premises and what where the working time limits. • Health & Safety re volume of vehicles parked overnight within the premises • Markon staff parking their personal vehicles on Inchnuek Rd • Markon lorries parking on Main Street with engines running.
<p>Item 3</p>	<p>Presentation from L Fleming & D Waldrum, Strathclyde Community Police</p> <p>Informed members of Neighbourhood Watch Scheme and supplied handouts and information pack.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Advised that scheme is resident led. • Enable residents to raise issues or complaints within the area • Residents can benefit from a reduction on their Home Insurance • Start-up is via web page • Requires Co-ordinator & Deputy co-ordinator for delegation • Canvassing campaign required to assess number of local residents agreeing to the scheme <p>Policing Issues – Parking issues currently being addressed. Youth disorder being a monitored and managed with a ‘flexi police patrol’ wearing high visibility jackets. Cycle trained police patrolling village on a regular basis.</p> <p>J Cassidy advised that he had recently been assaulted but could not get a response from the community police; he was advised that he should have reported the incident direct to the police and got an incident number.</p> <p>Noise Pollution – licence dept has been made aware of problem. D Waldrum advised that the issue should be raised via NLC Environmental Dept and can be done anonymously.</p> <p>Traffic – currently being addressed re slow down of traffic. Traffic project of traffic count to be arranged via S Robertson. More speed camera action within area to be arranged.</p> <p>Bins – new design dog bin to be issued when available. J Cassidy request one to be sited within the Redrow Estate, The</p>

	<p>ducks Walk and also at Croftfoot cottages.</p> <p>A letter has been sent from the police re the crossing route and bus route within the Oval area and has requested this area of traffic to be managed by a 'one way system'.</p>
Item 4	<p>Presentation from Fiona Campbell – Community Learning & development NLC Locality Manager</p> <p>Remit covers;</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. working with children & youth groups 2. community based adult learning i.e. computer skills training etc 3. community learning – support for voluntary groups <p>NLC team is made up of 25 workers, who can assist with</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • setting up organisations • constitutions • committee skills & structures • support office bearer • funding <p>F Campbell advised that there is funding available, however the community council must identify what the funding is required for and what it can be spent on. All grants are council approved. The committee must ensure that the grants applied for do not conflict with any current grants previously issued to the Neighbourhood House. Advised that we could possibly discuss the facility of promoting the community council via the Village Newsletter.</p> <p>M black to request F Campbell's assistance if no notification of community Council Grant within 10 days.</p>
Item 5	<p>Kilgarth</p> <p>H Bainford advised that there is still no retrospective planning on course to extract peat in April. Advised can't be done until bond & retrospective planning in place. H Bainford getting no response from planning.</p> <p>Landfill site is owned by GCC not Kilgarth</p>
Item 6	<p>A.O.B.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Banks meeting – community park concern as main entrance to village will be via industrial estate (Gartcosh) this would be a first in the UK. Community council would like to propose an alternative. • C Kelly advised all of Gartcosh Community council – Structure plan office talks from David Jones and suggested as many Glenboig members attends.
