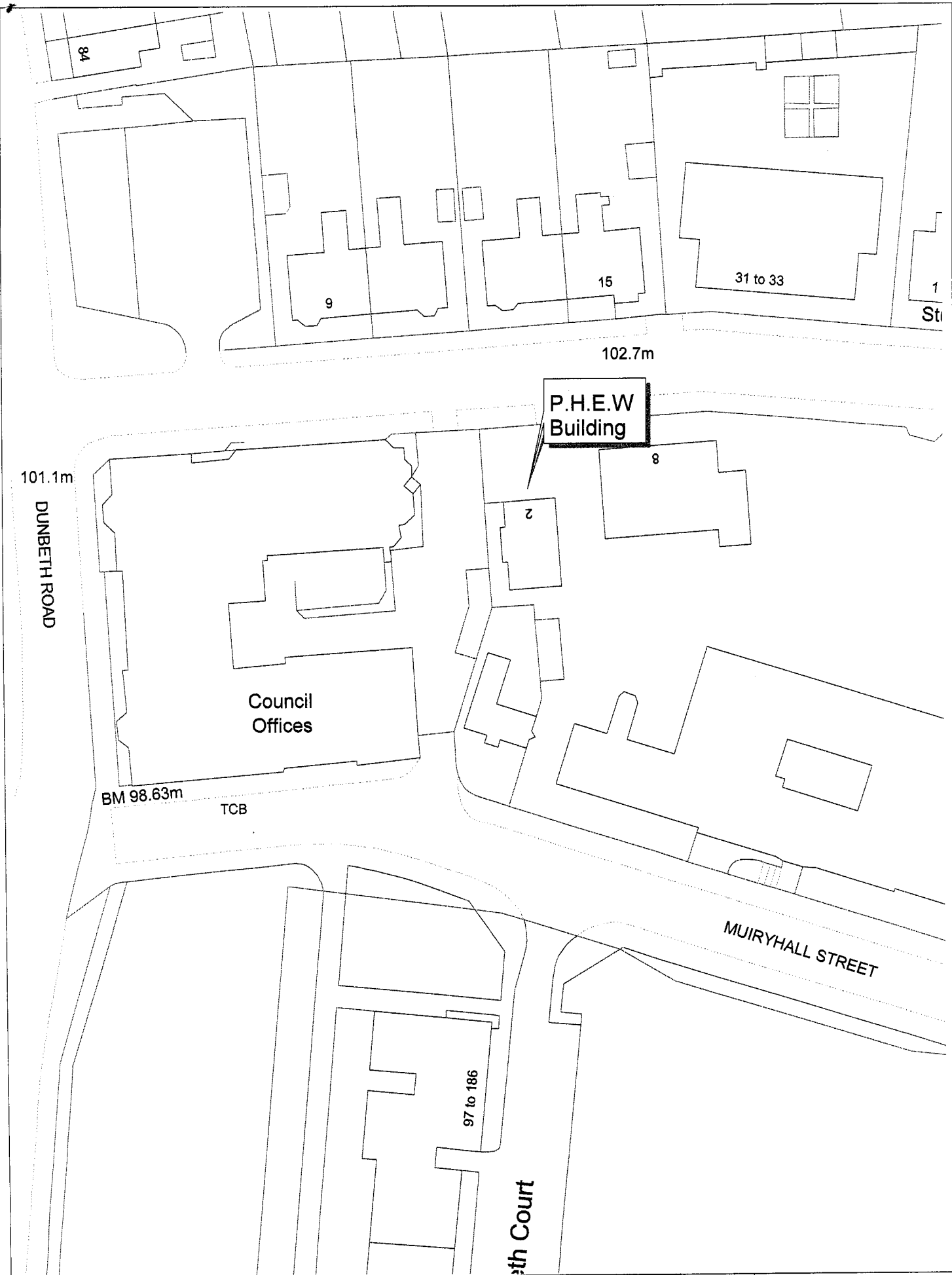
1. BACKGROUND
