1. The Chief Solicitor (Licensing) advised (1) that an application (tabled) by David Carroll, 62 Redburn Road, Whitelees, Cumbernauld for a Private Hire Car Licence had been received, and (2) of the background relative thereto.

The Sub-Committee then heard the applicant and Chief Superintendent Buchan speak in respect of the application.

The Sub-Committee then heard (1) Councillor Pentland outline his objections to the application; (2) Robert Morton, Brunton Miller, Solicitors, outline the objections to the application by Mr. and Mrs. Dale, local residents; (3) Sandra Mousdale and Anthony Cameron, local residents outline their objections to the application; (4) Murray Reid, Department of Planning and Environment outline the Director of Planning and Environment's observations on the application, and (5) the applicant speak in support of his application.

Thereafter, due to the number of public present, the Sub-Committee withdrew to further deliberate and upon returning to the Council Chamber, resumed consideration of the matter.

Decided: that the application by J. Edward McGhee for a Second Hand Dealer's Licence be refused.
