Decided: that the application by Peter Hurll Jackson for the renewal of his House in Multiple Occupation Licence be granted.

(3) STREET TRADER'S LICENCE - NEW APPLICATION - MARY McCARRON, 18 TIBOR AVENUE, MOTHERWELL

4. The Chief Solicitor (Licensing) advised (1) that an application (tabled) by Mary McCarron, 18 Tibor Avenue, Motherwell for a Street Trader's Licence to enable her to trade from her static snack van in Netherhall Road, Excelsior Park, Netherton Industrial Estate, Wishaw had been received; (2) that an objection had been received from Mr. and Mrs. McPharlane, Tyle Cottage, Law, and (3) of the background relative thereto.
