HEARING - PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE - NEW APPLICATION - TREVOR SMITH, 19 COLVEND STREET, BRIDGETON, GLASGOW

1. The Head of Legal Services advised that an application by Trevor Smith, 19 Colvend Street, Bridgeton, Glasgow for a Public Entertainment Licence to hold a Family Funfare in Houldsworth Park, Wishaw on 30 and 31 August and 1 September 2001 had been received and that objections to the application had been received from (1) the local Member; (2) the Chief Constable; (3) 80 local residents via a petition, which was supported by the local Member of Parliament, and (4) Mr. Garrity, 11 Campbell Street, Wishaw.

The Sub-Committee then heard (1) Constable Wilson, Strathclyde Police, Traffic Division, outline the Chief Constable's objection; (2) Mr. Webster, 10 Loch Park, Wishaw in relation to the Petition; (3) Mr. Garrity, a local resident, and (4) Councillor Moran, the local Member, all of whom outlined their objection to the application. Mr. Smith then spoke in respect of the application.

Thereafter, the applicant, representatives of Strathclyde Police, Mr. Webster, Mr. Garrity and Councillor Moran withdrew from the meeting and the Sub-Committee resumed consideration of the matter.

The applicant, representatives of Strathclyde Police, Mr. Webster, Mr. Garrity and Councillor Moran were re-admitted to the meeting.

Decided: that the application by Trevor Smith for a Family Funfare to be held in Houldsworth Park, Wishaw on 30 and 31 August and 1 September 2001 be refused.
