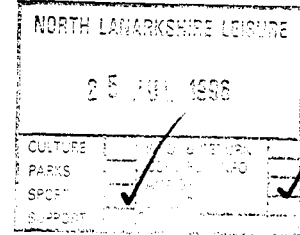

SPORTS GRANT FOR INTERNATIONAL TRAMPOLINE COMPETITOR

Over the last few years I have been receiving financial assistance from Monklands District Council to assist me in pursuing my sporting career. As North Lanarkshire is now the local authority I would be grateful if you would consider continuing this much needed and appreciated aid.

Monklands District Council provided me with almost £1000 last year and the money helped towards training costs, competition fee's and travel costs. I would like to point out that I also make applications to other bodies to enable the costs of pursuing my goals to be covered. This includes Monklands International Sports Trust and the Scottish Sports Aid Foundation. Last year the Scottish Sports Council awarded me a substantial special grant to enable me to gain much needed training abroad, with athletes of similar standards - as for the last few years I have been achieving a much higher standard than other Scottish competitors and find it difficult to achieve a training peak here.

I appreciate that my name may be relatively unknown to you, basically because trampolining does not receive much national press coverage. However, I do endeavour to publish as many results and news as possible, especially in the Airdrie & Coatbridge Advertiser. Also in 1995 I was voted Senior Sports Personality in Monklands District. I have included a resume of my results, forthcoming events, details of my general expenses and a reference from my coach.

CHRISTOPHER LINNEY - TRAMPOLINING

I am 25 years old and have just graduated from the University of Paisley with a B.Sc. Land Economics.

I have been involved in trampolining for 15 years now and have been in the national team for the last 10 years. I am the most experienced member of the team and regularly compete at international events. Recently I broke the Scottish record for the highest score achieved in competition.

At club level I am coached by Mike McGhee who was voted 1992 Coach of the Year by the British Coaching Foundation. Mike is also National Team Coach and has coached a number of successful internationalists. I train at Monklands Trampoline Club, based principally at the Time Capsule.

If all goes well at the forthcoming World Cups, I hope to be able to compete in the next rounds to be held in Australia and New Zealand next year. This is to enable me to progress to the World Cup Final 1997, finances permitting, where only the Worlds top ten have qualified to compete.

I am also involved in coaching, judging and am the Western Division Liaison Officer for the Scottish Trampoline Association.


I am writing to request the use of the running track at Airdrie Leisure Centre for a fund-raising event.



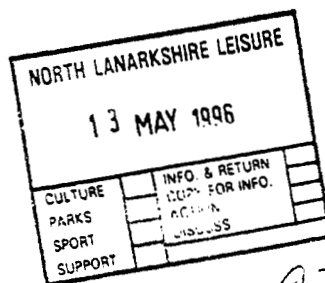

Steven was born with a rare condition known as *Cornelia de Lange Syndrome*. (C.D.L.S.) and I know of only 10 other Scottish families. There was very little information on CDLS when Steven was born in June 1981, all we knew was that he would be mentally handicapped and that it was unlikely that he would live beyond his 1st birthday. "Just take him home and love him" we were told.

Well Steven is still here he can walk, he's very mischievous, he talks non-stop and is "usually" a lovely wee boy! He was sixteen years old in June and goes to Clydeview School for mentally handicapped children in Motherwell which he loves. He can't read or write but loves drawing pictures, baking, swimming lessons and helping around the house - he's a dab hand with a screwdriver or paintbrush!

Steven has had quite a few medical problems in the last few years and has attended Yorkhill Hospital in Glasgow for operations on his gullet, stomach and bowel. He was very poorly for quite a while and his weight dropped to under two stones, because his gullet kept closing over he had to have a special tube inserted into his stomach and we fed him through this for nearly 18 months. He still has his tummy tube for backup reasons should his gullet close again. He manages to eat soft foods and he really loves milkshakes and skips.

One of Steven's greatest loves is music and is a great fan of Daniel O'Donnell and the Dubliners in fact anything Irish, our family joke is that one of his blood transfusion packs must have been donated by an Irishman! Steven got a keyboard for Christmas last year which he's learning to play - a great star of the future maybe!

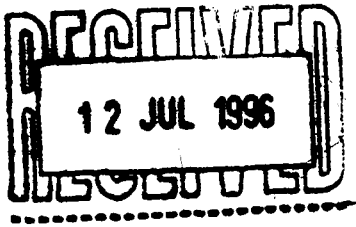
