1. Purpose of Report

The Committee are asked to approve the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order to introduce a one-way operation on Scott Street, Motherwell from its junction with Dalziel Street south westwards then south eastwards on Park Street to its junction with Coursington Road, a distance of 290 metres or thereby.

2. Report

- 2.1. Scott Street, Motherwell is located in an industrial area to the east of Motherwell Town Centre and there are no existing Orders on Scott Street, Motherwell at present.
- 2.2. North Lanarkshire Council is proposing to construct a new office building on the site of Scott Street Car Park and the land adjacent. However, there are existing parking problems for the surrounding premises.
- 2.3. The problems have been investigated and the most suitable solution is to convert Scott Street, Motherwell to one-way ensuring safe access for both the new and surrounding premises.
- 2.4. The Council has advertised its proposals to introduce the Order by way of public advertisement, to which no objections were received. In addition, the Chief Constable, the Road Haulage Associated Limited, the Freight Transport Association Limited, the local Councillor as well as various public and other bodies have been consulted and have offered no objections to the proposals.

3. Recommendation

That the Committee approve the introduction of the North Lanarkshire Council (Scott Street and Park Street, Motherwell) (One-Way Traffic Regulation) Order 2007 as detailed in Section 2 of the report.
