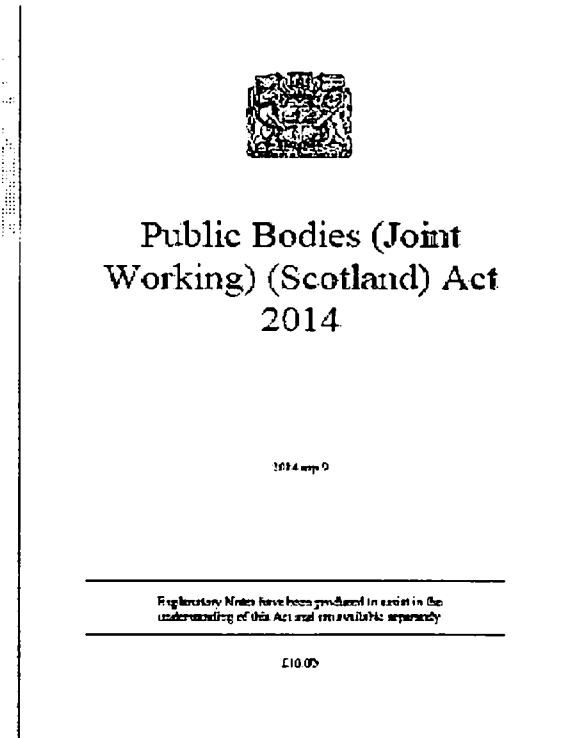

Joint Integration Board (JIB)

Has a statutory responsibility to plan for social work, justice, adult and children's services along with health care and a proportion of hospital based care including A&E services.

- 3 Non-executive directors from NHSL – Dr Avril Osborne, Ms Margaret Morris and Mr Michael Fuller
- 1 executive director from NHSL -Dr Harpreet Kohli (Director Public Health)
- Current budget is £500m with children, families and justice funding still to be added

Areas of Responsibility

- Community based health services e.g. District Nursing, GP services etc.
- Hospital based health services e.g. Emergency Department, Older People hospital services etc.
- Community based social work services e.g. Home Support and Child/Adult Protection

National Outcomes

- People are healthy, well and live in good health for longer
- People live at home or in a homely setting in their community
- People have positive experiences of services, and have their dignity respected
- Health and social care services help to maintain or improve the quality of life of people who use those services
- Health and social care services contribute to reducing health inequalities

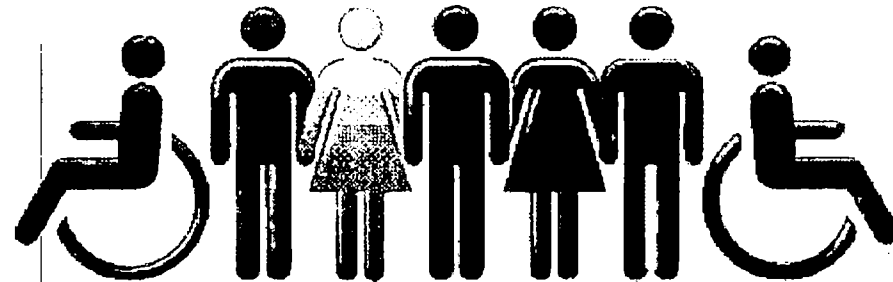
Vision

- Receive the information support and care they need, efficiently and effectively, at the right times and in the right places.

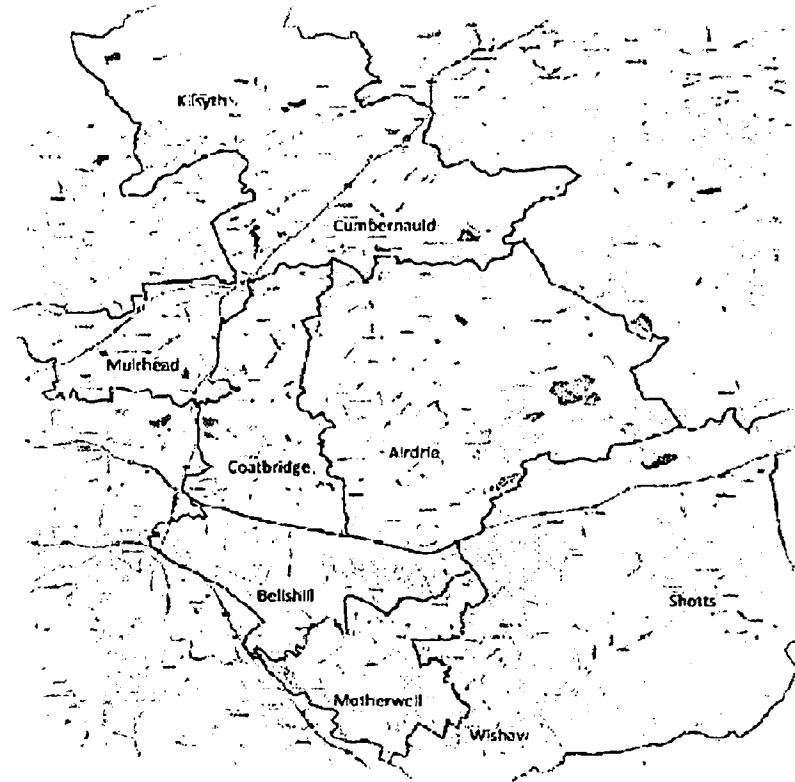

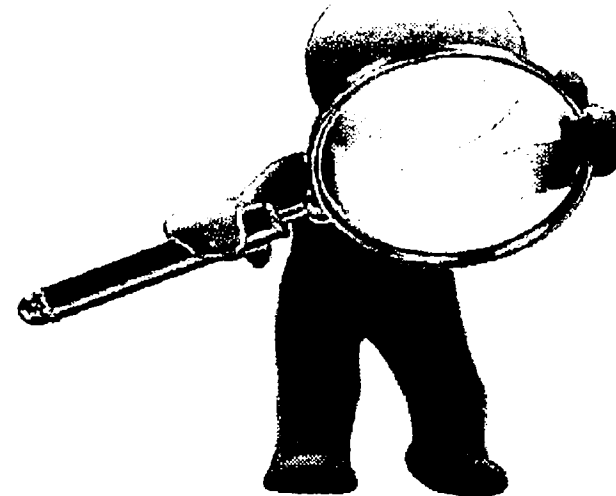
Locality Profiles

Motherwell Locality

- ❖ Developing first point of contact and out of hours access.
- ❖ Alcohol-development of crises intervention services to identified demand.
- ❖ Reducing the number of admissions to residential, A&E and nursing care for older people.
- ❖ Supplementing advice and support to carers.
- ❖ Developing information and consultation to inform longer term strategic objectives and measurement of outcomes with partners and service users all of teams.

Motherwell Locality

- ❖ More coordinated care and support across different professionals
- ❖ Agreed measurements for standards and consistency of quality of services
