

Healthier Independent lives 

Joint Integration Board (JIB)

Has a statutory responsibility to plan for social work, justice, adult and children's services along with health care and a proportion of hospital based care including A&E services.

- 4 NLC Councillors - Cllrs McGuigan, Logue, Kelly, & Goldie
- 3 Non-executive directors from NHSL – Dr Avril Osborne, Ms Margaret Morris and Mr Michael Fuller
- 1 executive director from NHSL -Dr Harpreet Kohli (Director Public Health)
- Current budget is £500m with children, families and justice funding still to be added

Areas of Responsibility

- Community based health services e.g. District Nursing, GP services etc.
- Hospital based health services e.g. Emergency Department, Older People hospital services etc.
- Community based social work services e.g. Home Support and Child/Adult Protection

National Outcomes

- People are healthy, well and live in good health for longer
- People live at home or in a homely setting in their community
- People have positive experiences of services, and have their dignity respected
- Health and social care services help to maintain or improve the quality of life of people who use those services
- Health and social care services contribute to reducing health inequalities

Bellshill Locality

- Supporting people to build on their strengths – asset based approach at first point of contact.
- Strengthening networks already in place through Reshaping Care and sustaining and expanding Community Capacity Building.
- Continuing to support carers and identifying those who do not recognise themselves as having a caring role at an early stage to avoid carer breakdown.
- Building on established good practice of supporting people with Dementia in our community but require an integrated approach to support people within our Very Sheltered complexes to avoid inappropriate admissions to hospital and Nursing Care.
- Reducing the negative impact of alcohol on our community – impact on GP Services, A & E, Mental Health Services, Police and Fire Services – escalating to Adult Protection concerns, Child Protection concerns, Domestic Abuse and early admission to Nursing Care
