

North Lanarkshire Council
Reema Road, Bellshill
(Temporary Traffic Management) Order 2018

On 22 May 2018 the North Lanarkshire Council made the above-named Order under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and in exercise of all other enabling powers, which makes it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles being used in connection with the Public Procession on 2 June 2018) on Reema Road, Bellshill from the extended line of the western kerb of Bairdsland View, westwards for a distance of 235 metres or thereby.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the west side of the closure wishing to access the east side of the closure should proceed north westwards then westwards on Reema Road, north westwards then north eastwards on Hattonrigg Road, westwards on Keith Street, south eastwards on North Road, eastwards then south eastwards on Campbell Street and north eastwards on Bairdsland View to the east side of the closure.

Vehicles on the east side of the closure wishing to access the west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

No Waiting Restrictions

To apply to both sides of Reema Road, Bellshill from the extended line of the eastern kerb of Bairdsland View, north eastwards for a distance of 375 metres or thereby.

No Waiting and No Loading Restrictions

Belgrave Street, from its junction with Gartcosh Walk to its junction with Inchinnan Road.
Clark Way, Bellshill over its entire length.
Inchinnan Road, Bellshill over its entire length.
Larkin Way, Bellshill over its entire length.

Appropriate signage will be in place advising drivers of the restrictions during the closure.

Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

The Order, which will only be operational when displayed by signs, will come into operation at 0001 hours and remain in operation until 2359 on Saturday, 2 June 2018.

The North Lanarkshire Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as “The North Lanarkshire Council (Reema Road, Bellshill) (Temporary Traffic Management) Order 2018” and shall be effective, only when displayed by signs, during the period from 0001 hours until 2359 hours on Saturday, the second day of June, Two thousand and eighteen.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles being used in connection with the Public Procession on 2 June 2018) on Reema Road, Bellshill from the extended line of the western kerb of Bairdsland View, westwards for a distance of 235 metres or thereby.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on the west side of the closure wishing to access the east side of the closure should proceed north westwards then westwards on Reema Road, north westwards then north eastwards on Hattonrigg Road, westwards on Keith Street, south eastwards on North Road, eastwards then south eastwards on Campbell Street and north eastwards on Bairdsland View to the east side of the closure.

Vehicles on the east side of the closure wishing to access the west side of the closure should proceed vice versa.

No Waiting Restrictions

To apply to both sides of Reema Road, Bellshill from the extended line of the eastern kerb of Bairdsland View, north eastwards for a distance of 375 metres or thereby.

No Waiting and No Loading Restrictions

Belgrave Street, from its junction with Gartcosh Walk to its junction with Inchinnan Road.
Clark Way, Bellshill over its entire length.
Inchinnan Road, Bellshill over its entire length.
Larkin Way, Bellshill over its entire length.

Appropriate signage will be in place advising drivers of the restrictions during the closure.

Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.
