	<p>designated work had started.</p> <p>Play Area Equipment</p> <p>H McVey advised that she had met with the Cumbernauld & Kilsyth Local Area Development Group Play Services who had already set aside £20,000 and through discussion got them to increase their funding commitment to £40,000. She suggested that either a sub group of the Community Council or a Community group of parents and other interested parties within the village should take forward an initiative to look at supporting play in Banton and additional funding.</p> <p>It was suggested that the Community Council could arrange an open meeting which Heather McVey & Play Services would host the meeting.</p> <p>H McVey agreed to identify dates when Play Services would be available and communicate these to the CC so that they could arrange hall booking.</p> <p>Speeding Traffic at Kelvinhead</p> <p>Eileen Spence again raised concerns at the speed at which traffic passes along the stretch of road at Kelvinhead that is a designated 30mph limit. She acknowledged that the police had been out, once to the best of her knowledge, at a time that was mid-afternoon.</p> <p>H McVey was able to advise that The issues regarding availability of the speed gun technology had been addressed and that the Cumbernauld and Kilsyth Local Development Group had purchased a speed gun for the Banton & Kelvinhead area.
