**DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST IN TERMS OF THE ETHICAL STANDARDS IN PUBLIC LIFE ETC. (SCOTLAND) ACT 2000**

1. No declarations were made.

**It was agreed, in terms of Section 50A(4) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973, that the public be excluded from the meeting for the following items on the grounds that the business involved the likely disclosure of exempt information as defined in paragraphs 6 and 14 of Part 1 of Schedule 7A of the Act.**

**HEARINGS**

**(1) STREET TRADER'S LICENCE – NEW APPLICATION - CHARLES McCOLE**

2. The Acting Managing Solicitor advised (1) that an application (tabled) by Charles McCole for a Street Trader's Licence to enable him to trade from a static snack van at Craignethan Drive, Gartcosh had been received, and (2) that objections (tabled) to the application had been received from Councillors Hogg and McLaren, local Members; the Executive Director of Regeneration and Environmental Services, and the Chief Constable, Police Scotland.

The Administrative Officer then indicated that Councillors Hogg and McLaren were not in attendance.

Thereafter, the Sub-Committee resumed consideration of the matter in Councillors' Hogg and McLaren's absence.

The Sub-Committee then heard (1) John Ashcroft, Roads and Transportation Division outline the Executive Director of Regeneration and Environmental Services' objection to the application; (2) Sergeant McGovern outline the Chief Constable's objection to the application, and (3) Charles McCole speak in support of his application.

Thereafter, the applicant, John Ashcroft and the representative of the Police withdrew from the meeting and the Sub-Committee resumed consideration of the matter.

The applicant, John Ashcroft and the representative of the Police were then re-admitted to the meeting.

**Decided:** that the application by Charles McCole for a Street Trader's Licence be refused.

**(2) TEMPORARY PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE – NEW APPLICATION - JOE DONACHIE**

3. The Acting Managing Solicitor advised (1) that an application by Joe Donachie for a Temporary Public Entertainment Licence to hold a Music Festival in Colzium Estate, Colzium House, Colzium Lodge Access Road, Kilsyth on 28 June 2014 had been received; (2) that an objection to the application had been received from the Chief Constable, Police Scotland; (3) that a representation had been received from the Executive Director of Regeneration and Environmental Services, and (4) that Joe Donachie had subsequently withdrawn his application.

**Decided:** that it be noted that Joe Donachie had withdrawn his application for a Temporary Public Entertainment Licence.
