Matters Arising –

- Playpark – G Stewart spoke to Cllr Beveridge and T Morgan regarding flooding in the playpark area.
- Village walkabout still to be arranged.
- Feature wall looking good – G Stewart reported that discussions were still on going with production company regarding signage.
- Reference was made to planning objection – this would be brought up during correspondence.
- McArthur Avenue development – NL Homes ground investigation around 18th March.
- Pavement has been cleared on Condorrat Road from the graveyard to Brackenhirst.

Correspondence –

- Acknowledgement from planning objection re proposed Windsor Drive development has been received.
- Monthly planning notification – nothing affecting Glenmavis.
- Notification of NL Proposed Plan.

Treasurers Report – same as last month – M Anderson received a cheque for purchase of new printer.

AOCB –

- Defibrillator – it was suggested that a defibrillator be purchased and placed at a central position possibly in a secure cabinet on the wall outside the chemists shop.
- Meldrum Mains – the burn running through this area has developed a strong smell and has turned blue in colour – Sepa have investigated. L Ewing and C Stewart will speak to school about this matter as the children from the school and nursery use this area.
- School Janitorial Staff – 3 janitors have to be responsible for 5 schools in the future.
- Point raised by Angela Watt, Campsie View Riding stable, excess litter on roads in and out of village – M Anderson to contact Cleansing Department.
- Flower barrels may be available for village display – suggested they are placed next to new village signage – M Anderson stated she would be prepared to put plants in them.
- Car parking – suggestions were made that grass areas on Rydenmains Road and Condorrat Road be removed and made into areas suitable for parking cars. This would relieve congestion on the road and allow the bus to pass.
