Matters arising	<p><b>Play Area Equipment</b> H McVey hosted an open meeting on 21<sup>st</sup> January for villagers interested in becoming involved in play area project. Several locals attended and agreed to form a steering group to take this forward. H McVey reiterated that £60,000 had been committed to the project through the Local Development Programme. The villagers met with Ross Dunn and Colin Bruce. The meeting was very positive and all agreed that this was a chance to create a bespoke area matched to the needs of the village. It is hoped that this will now be community driven with a possible lifespan of approximately 18months. There was a short discussion regarding sourcing additional funding via fundraising events and from the Action Fund. A Ferrie to follow this up with CC chair W Hoyle and report back at next meeting. The steering group will also be working with the local primary school and its parent council to see how they can become involved.</p> <p><b>Speeding Traffic at Kelvinhead</b> On-going. – initial discussions with the traffic department were not very positive regarding some suggestions raised by the CC, however G Frew &amp; J Jones are working together to revisit this with new and innovative ideas.</p> <p><b>CC Facebook Page</b> George Frew has set this up and the page has 54 members to date. The CC agreed that this site should be used in a positive way and that individual concerns should be raised directly with the CC. H McVey reported that John Ashcroft, Business Environmental Asset Management had responded directly to Mr Dougal, local resident regarding his 7 separate areas of concern.</p> <p><b>Bin Issues</b> H McVey suggested that a request should be made for a larger bin to be located outside the school gates to solve the problem.</p> <p><b>Buses</b> On-going. It was suggested the CC should send a letter to the Hall Committee outlining the problem and asking them to discuss with those letting the hall at the identified times of concern.</p> <p><b>Additional parking in the village</b></p> <p>Jean Jones advised the Colin Bruce, Community Capacity Building Officer was planning to consult with relevant residents on the private road at the hall. He may then offer a much wider consultation to all residents in the future.</p> <p>J Jones agreed to invite Colin to the next CC meeting.</p> <p>H McVey suggested that in the Spring the CC could organise a village “walkabout” so that areas of concern could be identified by residents.</p> <p><b>AOCB</b></p> <p>J McKelvie identified several areas eg drains and pavements that required attention in 3 areas around the village. This and possible first aid courses for the village were discussed.</p> <p>G Frew raised a concern regarding gritting within the village.
