**Minutes of the public meeting held at 7.30 pm on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> June 2019 in the Westerwood Hotel, 1 St Andrews Drive, Cumbernauld G68 0EW**

### **Welcome**

Tom Law welcomed everyone and opened the meeting at 7.30 pm.

### **Minutes**

Minutes from the public meeting held on 7 March, 2019 were respectively submitted by Tom Law, approved by Alan Wallace and seconded by Alan MacDonough.

### **Matters arising from Minutes**

There were no matters raised.

### **Police Update**

Both Catriona and Adam were unable to attend and a crime report was not available in time for the meeting.

### **Treasurer's Report**

Liz gave an update on the Community Council's bank account which stands at £1,446.50 as well as petty cash funds at £177.40.

### **Current Activities**

Following a meeting with the hotel manager Bill Burnett, when we discussed Dogs v Golfers, agreement was reached that we would arrange signs to be set up on pathways near the former 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> holes to remind people that - a) dogs should be kept under control when on the golf course, and b) owners should tidy up after their dog. He also stated there had been a recent report of shooting on the golf course. No hotel staff were involved and the incident was conveyed to the police.

### **Slide Presentation**

#### *Cleanup Campaign*

Tom made a presentation showing the success of our cleanup campaign with the support and assistance of many residents to help tidy areas of land in Westerwood. Thanks also to NLC staff at Wardpark Amenity Tip for supplying rubbish bags and litter grabs and for the prompt uplift of rubbish collected.

The first area to be tackled, on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> April, was the land between Queens and Kings Drive. On Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> May the woodlands near the former 11<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> holes were next to be undertaken. This was followed on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> May when we set about the litter around St Andrews Drive.

The final area to be covered, from 10 am till 12 noon on Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> June, will be the woodlands between Queens Drive and Dullatur roundabout and again backing from residents would be appreciated.

#### *Restoration*

Images were shown to highlight the effort carried out by residents to repair the fences and cleanse the carved stone signs at the entrance to Kings Drive. Work on the stone signs at Queens Drive continues.

#### *Road Closure*

Tom went on to show the temporary road closure of all roads leading to Old Inns roundabout which will take place from 8 pm on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> August till 6 am on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> August.

The closure is to allow resurfacing works around Old Inns to be carried out.

In effect Eastfield Road will be closed at the Westerwood roundabout. Also closed will be access from Castle Cary Road to Old Inns as well as the slip road from M80 north bound. M80 south bound can divert via the Village to gain access to Eastfield Road.
