(Temporary Traffic Management) Order 2022

The North Lanarkshire Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The North Lanarkshire Council (A723 Merry Street, Motherwell) (Temporary Traffic Management) Order 2022" and shall be effective during the period from 0001 hours on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, Two thousand and twenty-two until 2359 hours on Monday, the twenty-first day of March, Two thousand and twenty-two.
2. No person shall carry out a right turn manoeuvre (with the exception of vehicles engaged on Scottish Power infrastructure works) A723 Merry Street, Motherwell.

Prohibition of Right Turn

From A723 Merry Street to Dalziel Street

Alternative routes: Vehicles should proceed north eastwards on the A723, Merry Street, south eastwards on Wilson Street, south eastwards on Allan Street, south westwards on Coursington Road, then north westwards on Dalziel Street.

From A723, Merry Street to access adjacent to Nos.139-145 Merry Street

Alternative routes: Vehicles should proceed north eastwards on the A723, Merry Street, south eastwards on Wilson Street, south eastwards on Allan Street, south westwards on Coursington Road, then north westwards on Dalziel Street.

From access adjacent to Nos.139-145 Merry Street to Merry Street

Alternative Routes: Vehicles should proceed south westwards on Merry Street, continue on circulatory carriageway of roundabout at junction of A723, Merry Street and A721, Menteith Road, then north eastwards on A723, Merry Street.

Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.
