

North Lanarkshire Council
Thrashbush Road, Airdrie
(Temporary Road Closure) Order 2022

The North Lanarkshire Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 1 of the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The North Lanarkshire Council (Thrashbush Road, Airdrie) (Temporary Road Closure) Order 2022" which continues the restrictions currently in place by virtue of a similar Order made by the Council on Monday, the twenty-second day of November, Two thousand and twenty-one, will come into operation at 0001 hours on Saturday, the twelfth day of March, Two thousand and twenty-two and will remain in operation until 2359 hours on Friday, the twenty-ninth day of July, Two thousand and twenty-two.

2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle (with the exception of vehicles engaged on utility connection and road construction works) on Thrashbush Road, Airdrie from the extended south kerb line of Dykehead Road, southwards to the extended north kerblines of Ferguson Way by reason of works being executed on or near that location.

Alternative routes: Vehicles on Dykehead Road at the north side of the closure wishing to travel to Thrashbush Road at the south side of the closure should travel generally westwards on Dykehead Road, southwards on Thrashbush Quadrant, eastwards on Roughcraig Street, northwards on Thrashbush Road, to the south side of the closure

Vehicles on Thrashbush Road at the south side of the closure wishing to travel to Dykehead Road at the north side of the closure should travel generally southwards on Thrashbush Road, westwards on Roughcraig Street, northwards on Thrashbush Quadrant, eastwards on Dykehead Road, to the north side of the closure.

Pedestrian access will be maintained, where practicable, during the closure.

Vehicular access for residents will be maintained, where practicable, during the closure.
